BFPS welcomes RFA TIDESPRIING

RFA TIDESPRIING – A136 is the first of four MARS Tide Class fast fleet tankers entering service to support the Royal Navy and wider Defence. In particular they have been designed to support all Royal Navy warships, including the new aircraft carriers, HMS Queen Elizabeth and HMS Prince of Wales, wherever required in the world.

This official commemorative cover has been issued by the British Forces Philatelic Service, in conjunction with the Royal Fleet Auxiliary Association, to mark the introduction into service of this remarkable new state-of-the-art vessel.

The image used on the cover was taken by Capt SP Jones OBE, from the ship's boat, during the ship's 'delivery voyage' across the Pacific. The cover will bear a personalised Smiler stamp using an image taken by Pearl Harbour Pilot Wade Armstrong when RFA TIDESPRIING visited Hawaii. This stamp will be cancelled by the special handstamp BFPS 3210 which features the ship's badge.

The covers may be ordered from the BFPS online shop (www.bfps.org.uk/shop) at a cost of just £7.50. A limited-edition version, signed by prominent officers within the Royal Fleet Auxiliary, will also be available at £15. All of these covers have been conveyed in RFA TIDESPRIING during her sea trials.

Also available will be sheets of the personalised Smiler stamps used on the cover, priced at £38 per sheet. Please watch the BFPS website for further information.

BFPS is officially licensed by the UK MOD.

BFPS is managed by two retired career Army officers, each of whom has had extensive experience working within the BFPO in general and the Forces Philatelic Bureau in particular. The third member of the management team is an ex Royal Engineer Warrant Officer who has a passion for Forces philately. All are volunteers and are dedicated to keeping the Forces Philatelic Bureau alive and are working hard to ensure the future of this unique area of BFPO operations is secure and flourishes.
